


#### **Educational Assistance**

The lack of a skilled and educated workforce is one of the biggest barriers to economic development and private investment in an underdeveloped nation like Mozambique. For most Mozambicans, the possibility of a higher education is merely a dream. We help bridge the gap between aspiration and attainment.

Each year, we bring hope to a few promising and dedicated students by funding their education at a Mozambican university or trade school. This life changing opportunity gives these students the knowledge they need to secure a job in the workforce where they can become self-sufficient, provide for their families, and contribute to their communities.

In some cases, these students may even work with Hope of a Nation for a period to gain further experience in their field of study. Students who gain practical experience with a ministry like Hope of a Nation have an even greater chance of securing employment. Our very first graduate (not pictured) is now the director of a clinic in southern Mozambique where he also serves Hope of a Nation part-time in our Medical Outreach program.



### **Children's Ministry**

In the heart of our ministry's inception, a seed was planted—a vision that would bloom into our Children's Ministry. What began as a modest gathering of 35 to 40 children has blossomed into a vibrant community of over 100. Each week they gather in the backyard of a small home to enjoy a warm meal and learn about Jesus. Their tender young hearts are hungry for more than just physical sustenance, and their laughter echoes through the dusty streets of the village.

During Children's Day (June 1st) and Christmas. we hold a grand celebration, where the lunch becomes a feast, the cake a sweet indulgence, and the party favors or toys—tokens of love that transcend mere materiality.

This is more than a program; it's a sacred calling. Led by Tony Gonondo, whose own story is etched in resilience—a journey from orphaned streets to the embrace of grace. He knows firsthand the ache of loneliness, the hunger for belonging. Now, he and our Children's Ministry team pour their hearts into these children, mentoring and ministering with unwavering devotion.

## **Orphan Support**

In Mozambique, 12 million children—a staggering 52% of the population—face the harsh realities of life in poverty. Among them, 1.5 million are orphans, their innocence overshadowed by loss and vulnerability.

We stand as guardians of their dreams, providing more than just sustenance; we offer a lifeline, mentorship, and the knowledge of a Heavenly Father who loves them. We provide ongoing:

- **Nutritious Meals**: Their hungry bellies find solace in warm, wholesome food.
- **Hygiene Essentials**: Cleanliness becomes a shield against adversity.
- **Clothing**: We wrap them in dignity, ensuring warmth and modesty.
- **Education**: School fees, uniforms, and supplies—they step into classrooms, eyes alight with possibility.
- **Healthcare**: When illness strikes, we stand by their side, healing both body and spirit.

### **Medical Outreach**

In the vast expanse of Mozambique, the cry for medical care echoes across hills and valleys. Lives hang in the balance—lives that could be saved by a simple dose of compassion. The availability of medical care is a prevailing need throughout Mozambique. Many people die of easily treatable illnesses like malaria and dysentery because they either don't have access to health care or cannot afford the most basic treatments. Malaria, specifically, is so prevalent in the country that it accounts for 29% of all deaths and 42% of deaths in children under five. HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, cholera, and other diseases are prevalent as well.

Hope of a Nation's Medical Program is changing lives. We travel to rural communities where clinics are scarce. Our medical team—dedicated, compassionate—knock on doors, one by one. They listen to whispered ailments, touch fevered foreheads, and offer solace. We address common illnesses—simple yet life-altering. A fever quelled, a wound tended—the ordinary becomes extraordinary.

We also educate patients on disease prevention and how best to care for themselves through nutrition and hygiene. But sometimes, we uncover deeper wounds that defy our doorstep remedies. For these, we guide our patients to proper medical facilities, bridging the gap between despair and healing.

Our medical mission extends far beyond prescriptions or bandages! We sow seeds of hope and water them with compassion. As trust blooms, hearts open. Conversations shift from symptoms to souls. In these moments, the Gospel finds fertile ground.



#### **Medical Outreach (continued)**

#### In 2023:

- 527 patients attended
- 25 had a high probability of death if left untreated.
- 11% of patients were 31 to 82
- 27% of patients were 19-30
- 62% of patients were 18 and under
  - 22% of those were age 13 18
  - 40% of those were under 12

#### Most common illnesses:

- malaria (121 patients)
- pain
- infections
- fevers
- diarrhea
- blood pressure



#### **Farm**

In the sun-kissed fields of Mozambique, our Farming Project is flourishing - a symphony of growth, resilience, and community impact. The goals of this farm are multi-faceted. From it we teach others about agriculture and animal husbandry, provide food for our programs, and generate sustainable revenue for our ministry as a whole.

Let's delve into the fertile soil of our achievements in 2023:

**Crop Diversity:** Our fields swayed with a kaleidoscope of life—maize, peanuts, beans, rice, cabbage, tomatoes, peppers, lettuces, cucumbers, carrots, and even moringa trees! Each harvest whispers hope to hungry hearts.

**Agricultural Interns:** Nine passionate souls learned, sweated, and tended to crops with our team. Their hands, calloused yet tender, cultivated more than crops—they cultivated hope.

**Chicken Project Interns:** Three interns learned chicken rearing from our team, providing them hope for a better tomorrow.



#### Farm (continued)

**Feathered Ventures**: Our partnership with Young Africa resulted in 2500 chickens raised and sold, providing enough revenue to begin building our first two chicken houses on our own farm in 2024. This is another huge step towards sustainability.

**Infrastructure Transformation**: We've woven dreams into reality. A new water pump hums, quenching thirsty crops. Security lights now stand sentinel, warding off unseen threats. A trusty bicycle now pedals between fields and town. An old shed was transformed into an on-site storage facility and also provides a trusty shelter for our on-site security guard.

Our sturdy bridge and water containment channel that we began constructing in late 2022 was finished in early 2023. It now ensures that all our land is accessible year-round.

In this dance of earth and sky, we sow seeds that defy droughts and despair. For in these fields, we don't just grow food; we grow futures. We sow, another waters, and God gives the increase. To Him be the Glory!



## **2023 Expenditures by Program Category**




The above graph represents program expenses only. It is broken down to show what percentage was spent on each program category.

### 2023 Program vs Administrative Expenses

We utilized 93% of our revenue in 2023 toward program-related expenses, directly impacting the people and communities we serve. These essential programs include children's services, educational initiatives, medical and health services, agricultural projects, benevolent assistance, and other vital efforts.

The remaining 7% covered administrative expenses, ensuring efficient operations and sustainable growth.
